What are the negative impacts of being a doctor?

What is Alzheimer's disease and what are the causes?

What do you know about Parkinson's disease and its causes?

How does an ECG work?

Where are radicals produced and what are they?

Why are diseases screened for? What are the benefits and disadvantages?

Which is more stable: DNA or RNA? Why?

What are the limitations of a full hip replacement?

What happens to the brain to cause epilepsy?

How is the pharmaceutical industry related to medicine?

Describe how the body gets its energy.

How would you put disease into different categories?

Name a virus and explain what it does. Why is it so hard to fight against viruses using antibiotics?

If someone came into your GP surgery with a painful knee, what would you ask them?

What are the functions of the stomach? How is the wall of the stomach protected from acidic conditions?

What happens when you cut yourself? Is scar tissue skin?

What are the functions of the spine?

Can you tell us about any modern advances in dentistry?

How should the government spend money on NHS dentistry and prevention of dental disease? Are dentists portrayed badly in the media?

Which organ are you most interest in and why?

What is angioplasty?

Describe the structure of the heart and tell me about the circulatory system. How is a foetal heart different from a mature heart?

What are stem cells? What triggers differentiation and happens inside a cell to cause the cell to become specialised?

How would you isolate a lung stem cell?

What is the most common inherited disorder/genetic disease?

What are the immediate effects of high altitude on the body? Why can you not survive higher than a certain altitude without a pressure suit?

How would you go about designing a vaccine?

How would you break bad news to a patient?

Should prescribing nurses have to attend medical school?

How much blood is inside you? How would you measure the exact amount?

Why are elderly women more likely to develop osteoporosis?

How would you decide who gets organs between two patients when there is an organ shortage?

Estimate how much blood there is in the human body and explain how this amount could be measured.

When you eat a slice of toast, what happens?

What variables affect the drug you would give an animal?

Why is a horse faster than an elephant?

Why can't a fish breathe out of water?

How do we ensure animal welfare?

Why not vaccinate cattle against TB?

What is the point of a vet?

Why do you want to be a vet?

What is BSE?

How have animals adapted over time and what causes them to adapt? Are there any flaws in the theory of evolution? What other theories are there about how animals change?
